We are one of over twenty community based adult education program providers in Nova Scotia

WHAT WE DO

We offer Adult Foundation Education Essential Skills Empowerment (E3) programing [Junior High School Equivalency]. This may include support with higher levels.

HOW WE DO WHAT WE DO

We have daytime and evening class sessions. Our sessions are subject to enrollment numbers. Daytime session can be up to five hours per day, five days per week. Evening sessions can be up two hours per evening, two evenings per week.

WE ASSESS FOR SUCCESS

We teach using the Nova Scotia School for Adult Learning curriculum. We assess each student's accomplishment of the outcomes set out in the curriculum. At the end of each season each learner receives a certificate indicating outcomes achieved or the level completed.
